Update from Pastor Mark

Every year, I need to remind myself that spring tends to take a while to appear on the East End of Long Island. Thankfully, it has arrived.

In many ways, springtime is symbolic for what God does through the gospel: light emerging out of darkness, life springing from death, seeds taking root, dormancy yielding to growth. With this in mind, we are experiencing a springtime here at Grace Presbyterian Church.

GraceTeams, which we launched last May, are up and running, and they are having a tremendous effect on our church body and local community. Since our Mission Statement is – To REACH the Lost, BUILD Community, GROW Disciples, SERVE our Neighbors, and in all things WORSHIP God – we formed a team for each mission objective. So we have a REACH Team, BUILD Team, GROW Team, SERVE Team and a WORSHIP Team. Each team has two gifted and motivated leaders who are leading their teams toward excellence. After only one year, we have seen exponential benefits from each team. Imagine what the next five years will be like as God blesses the work of each team member!

In February, we held our sixth annual Christianity Explored class. Including leaders, we had fifty-three people attend. A large number of participants had never read the Bible; nor were they church-going types. After the seven-week class they had read through the entire Gospel of Mark and tried to answer three questions: Who is Jesus? Why did he come? And, what does it mean to follow him? God used the class to bring new Christians into his family, and a number of participants now enjoy coming to Grace Church on Sundays!

Another area that has experienced a spring-like effect is our giving. For a number of reasons, our giving was down significantly in 2015. We substantially reduced our 2016 budget and were challenged to obediently and joyfully give to the important work we are doing on the East End. I am so delighted by the way Grace Church has responded. Much of the year remains, but if we continue to allow the gospel to shape our generosity, we have every reason to believe we will exceed our budget and be enabled to expand our work not only on the East End but throughout Long Island and around the world.

If this summer is like those past, then we can expect lots of visitors to the Hamptons and to our church. Part of our vision is to be a strong gospel witness to those who visit the Hamptons during the summer. And so we seek to welcome all who come, whether for the summer or for just a day.

May the seeds sown this springtime grow into a bountiful harvest in the months ahead!
